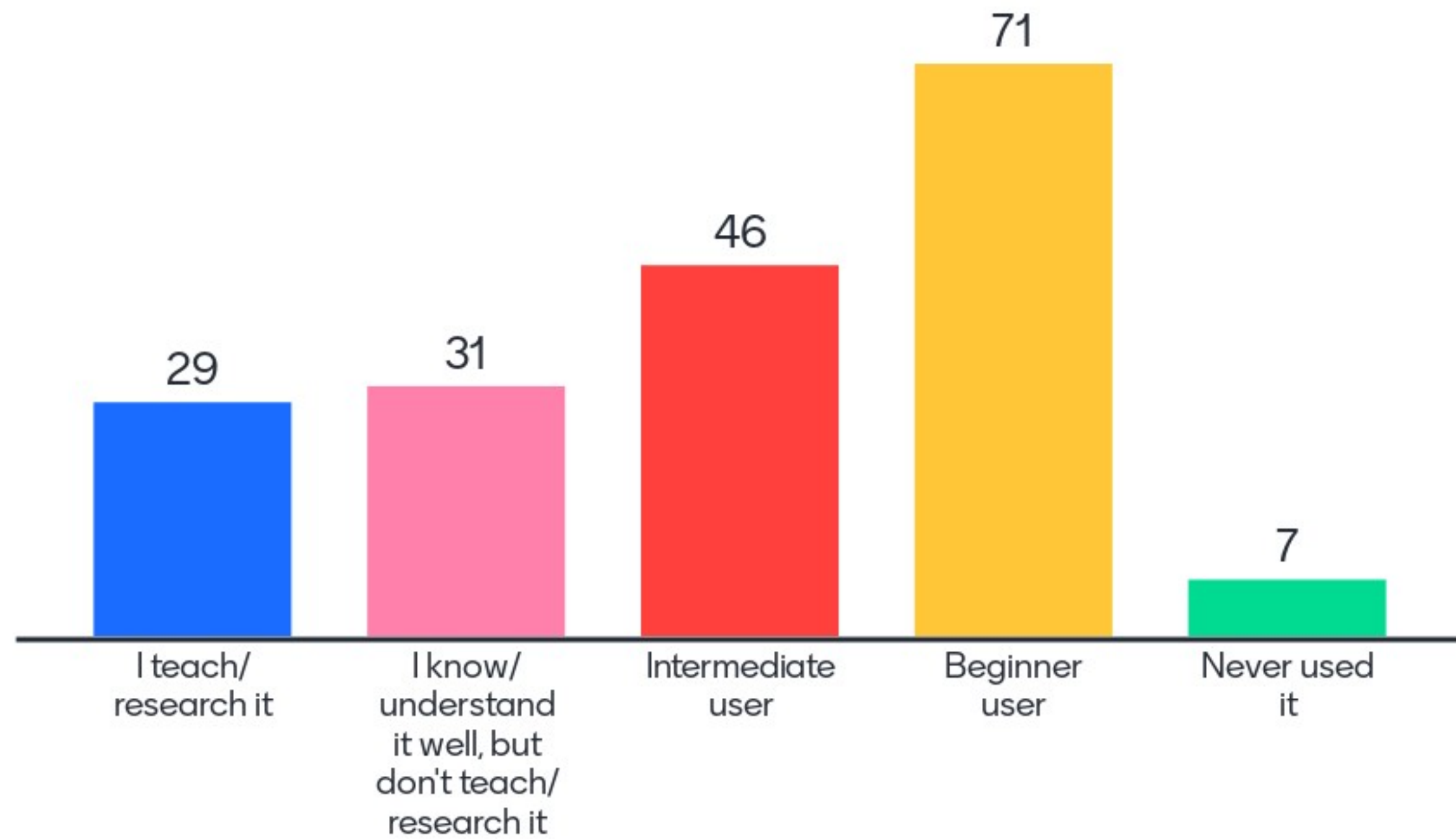

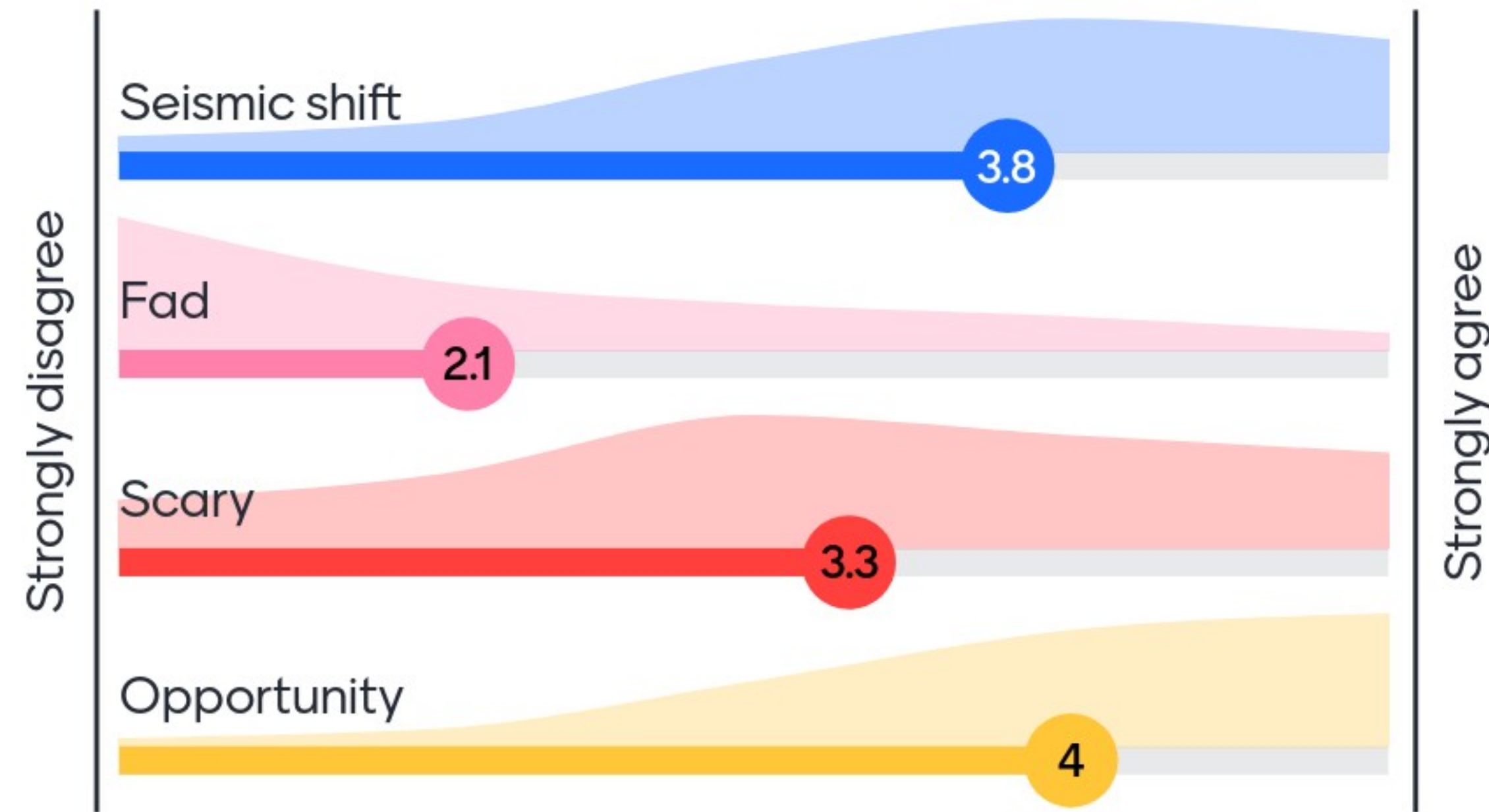

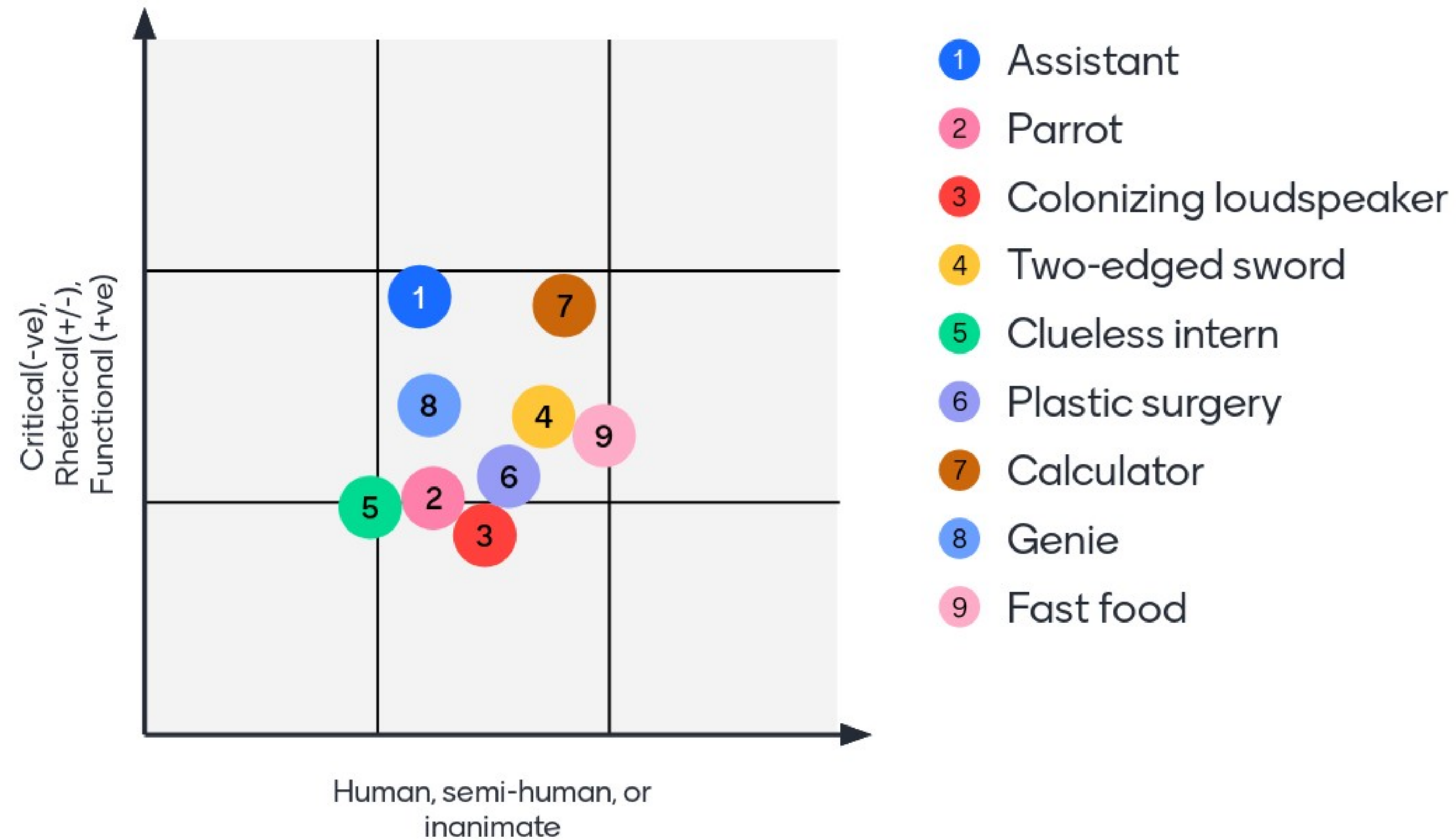

Intellectual honesty

Initial searching

Details on how it's trained, on the content of the cultural majority.
How to: unbiased prompt creation, citations, where to use it as an assistant to allow them to have their own creativity shine.

Precautionary principle

Scaffolding, Bias, mis/disinformation, fact checking, social justice, privacy, consent, Intellectual Property Rights, accessibility

Understanding the responsibility of the Agent vs the Tool.

Information literacy

How to use it in research and learning! But not in writing academic paper

What would you include in AI Literacies?

Digital and media literacy

Limitations of AI and it's not human, even though it appears to be.

LLM data sets created using people made to experience horrific working conditions and poor pay, that this black box tech makes more money for billionaires on the back of already exploited people.

Still getting to grips with what AI Literacy is, and what my role is in it.

Be critical, using the tools of critical literacy it can be applied to AI. Need to acknowledge AI but not centralise it

Real life uses in jobs

It's important to raise awareness of how much energy it takes to power AI as it directly impacts the environmental conversations being had. Need to use it responsibly - (aware this is challenging).
